Appendix

Survey methodology

The online survey, fielded by Qualtrics, was conducted in English using a quota sample demographically representative of the US population by age, gender, and income. Data from 2,444 participants over the age of 18 were collected from July 25th to August 2nd, 2024. The survey was approved by Rutgers University's Institutional Review Board (Principal Investigator Mark Paul). The survey was distributed to approximately 80,000 respondents on the Qualtrics panel. A total of 4,379 participants entered the survey, of which 1,302 were terminated due to ineligibility, 425 dropped out before completion, and 208 were removed in a quality check (speeders, failed attention check), resulting in 2,444 valid completes. Responses were forced for questions included in this analysis, leaving no missing responses or incomplete data. Analyses include probability weights created with a <u>post-stratification ranking procedure</u> based on Census estimates as established by Matthew DeBell and Jon A. Krosnick for <u>ANES</u>.
